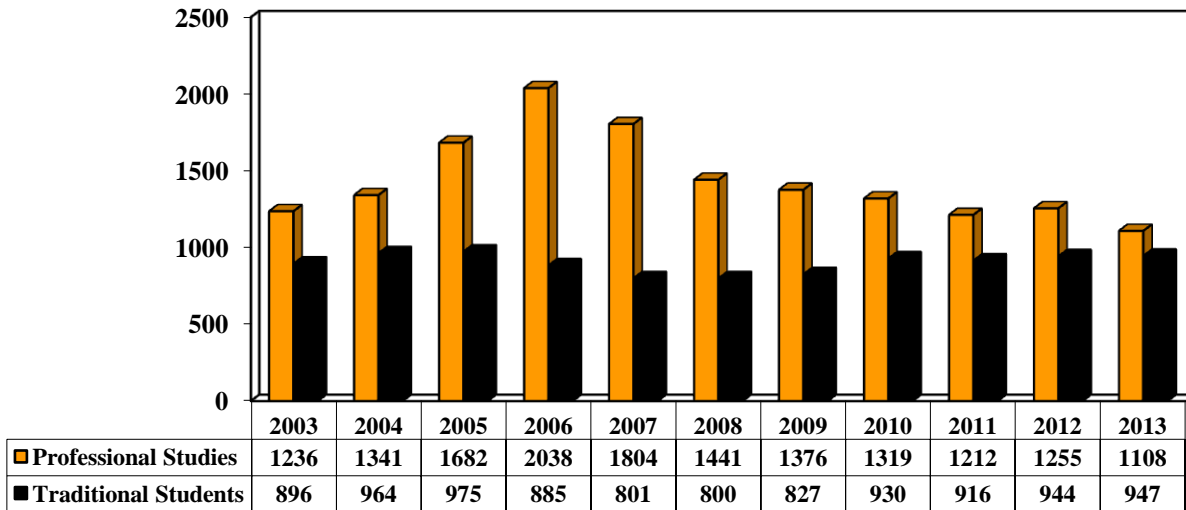

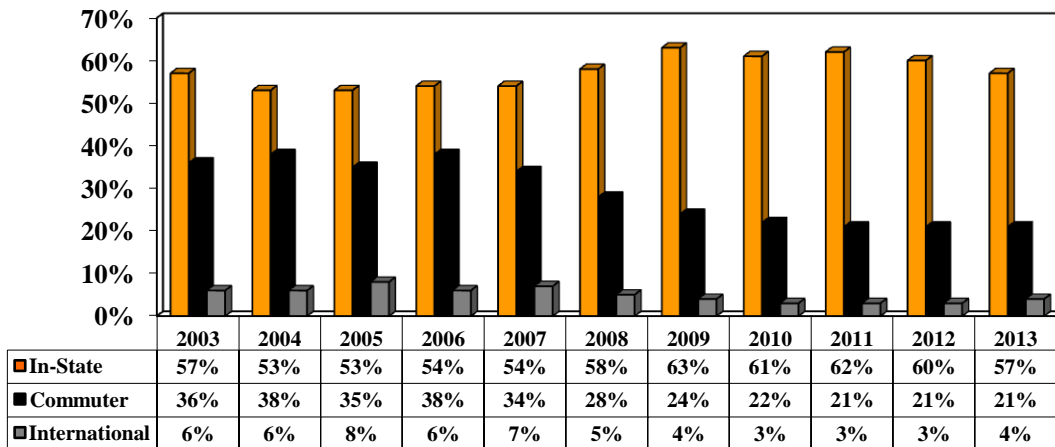

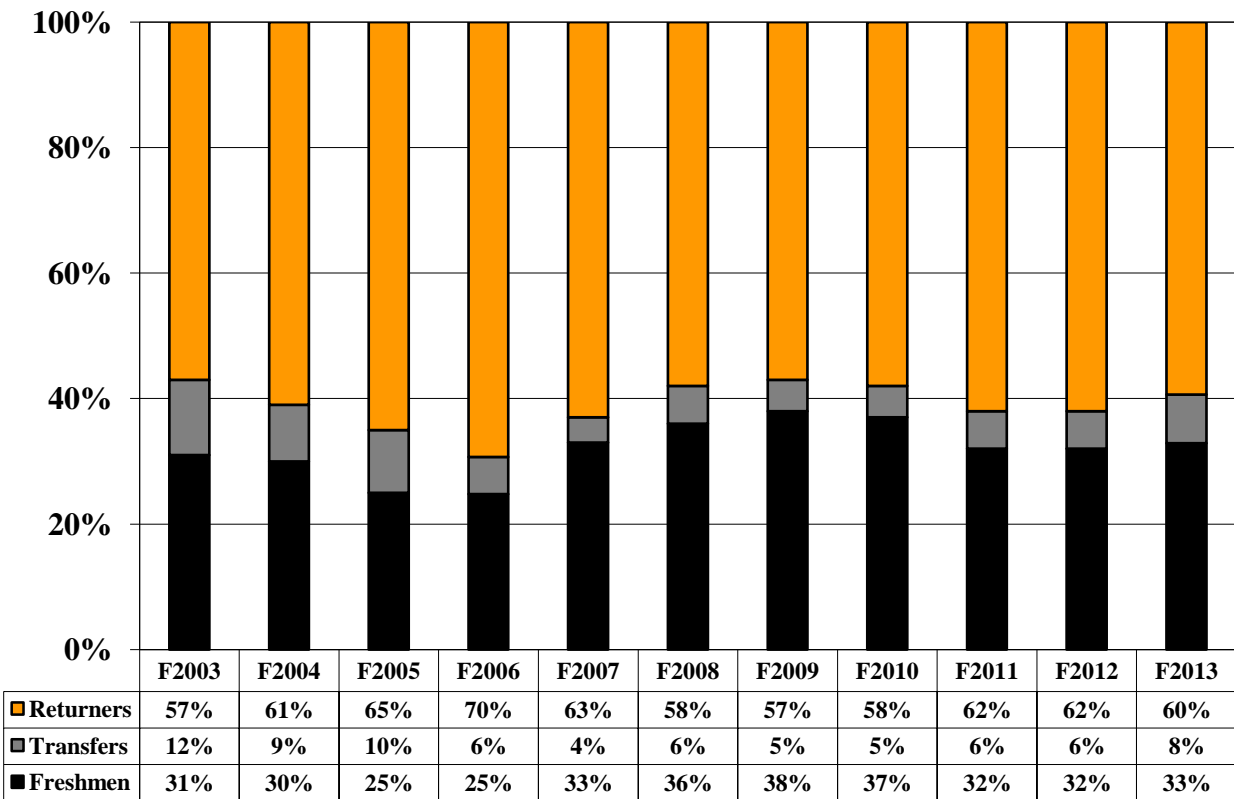

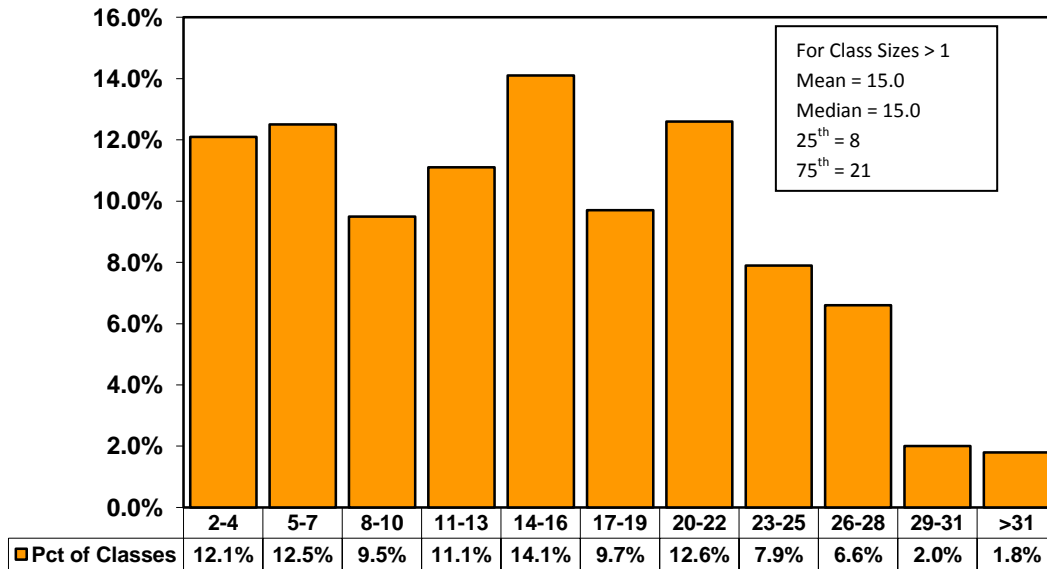

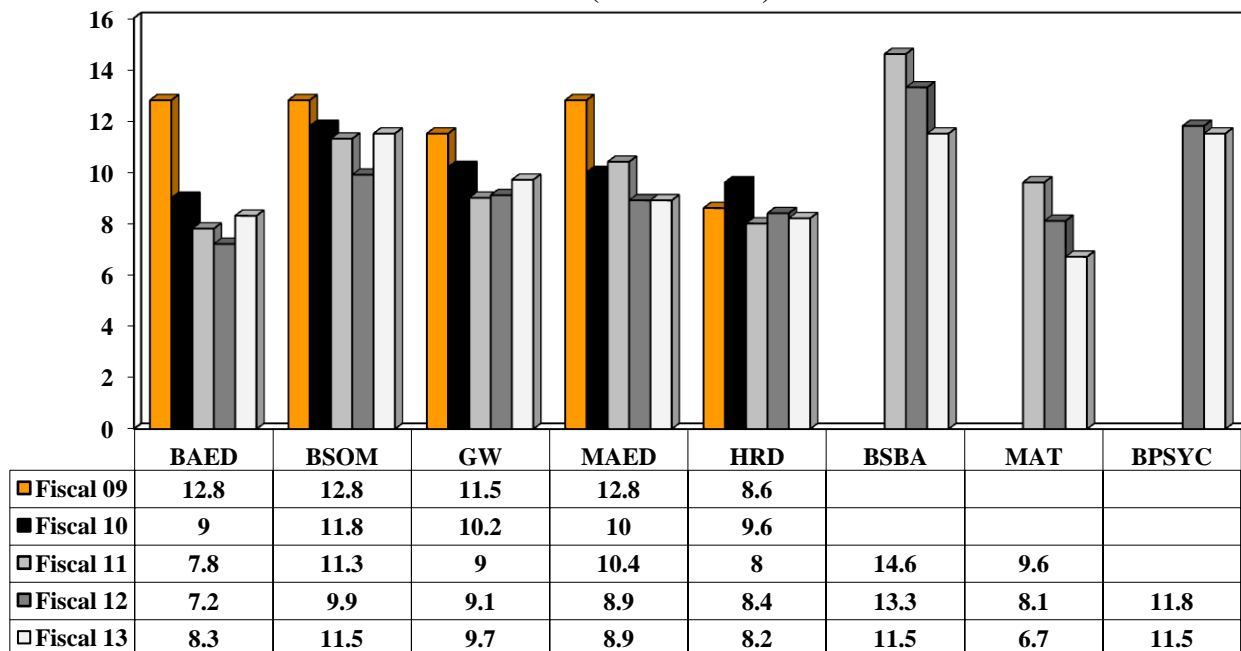
Class Sizes 2012-13

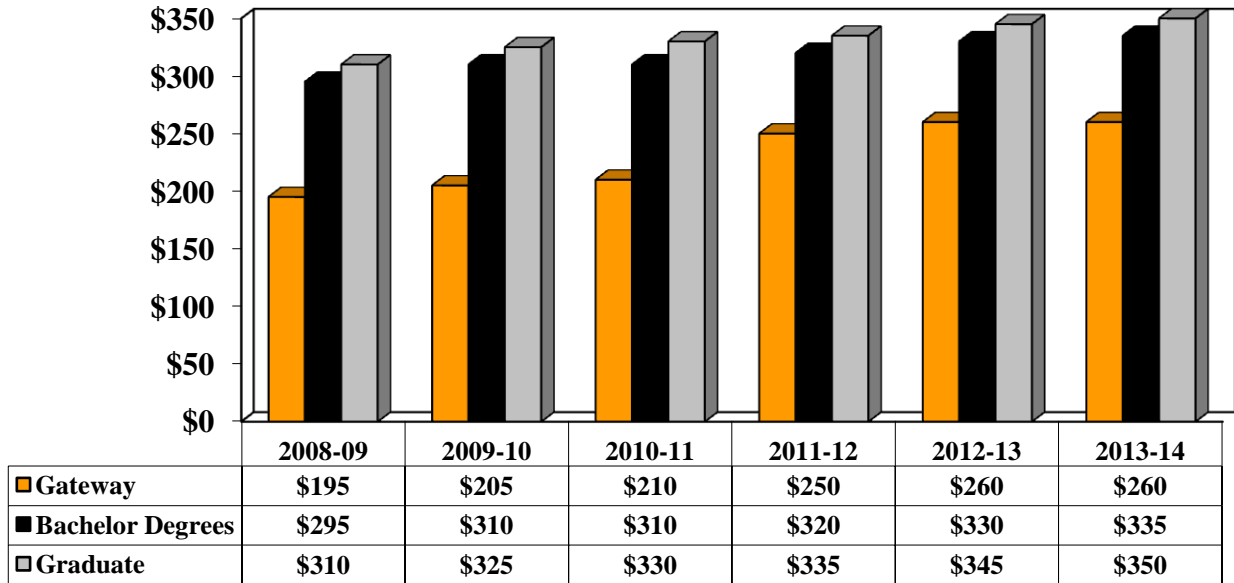
Graduate and Professional Studies Average Class Size

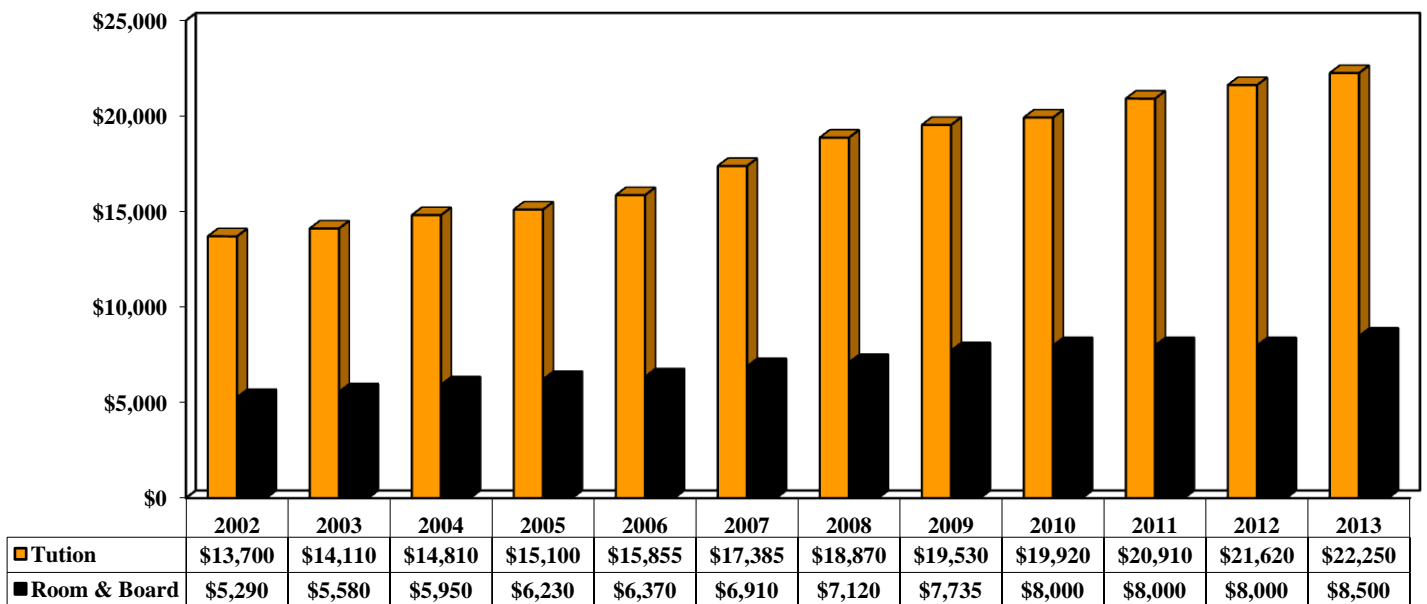

Graduate & Professional Studies Cost per Semester Hour

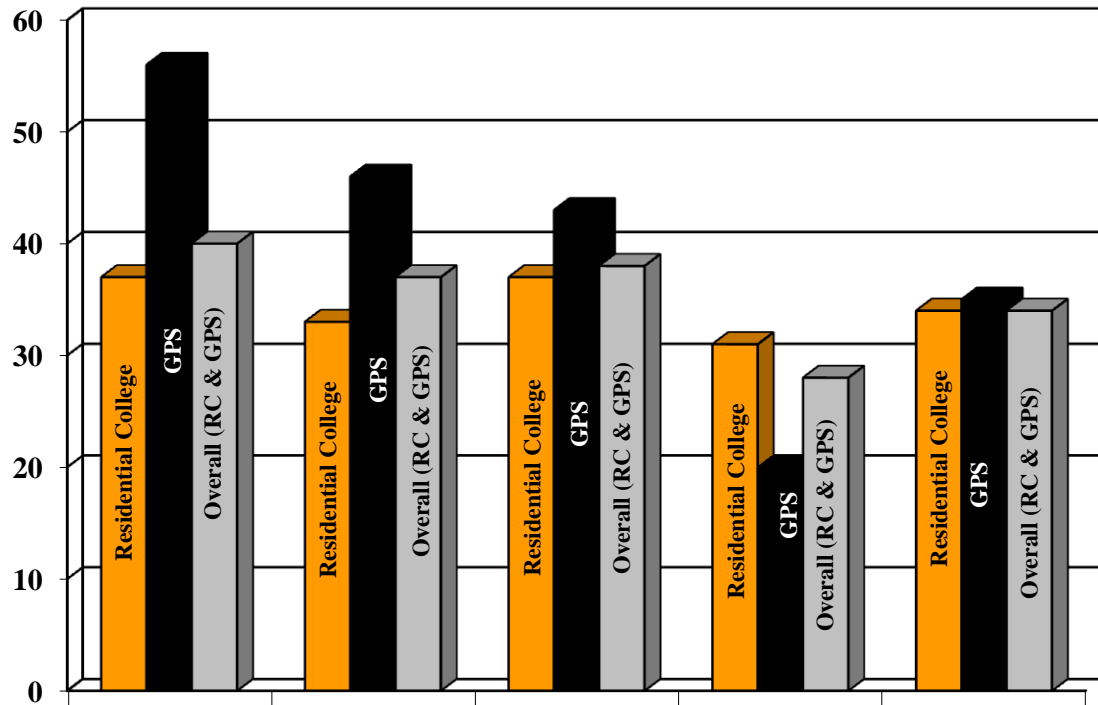


Traditional College Tuition, Room & Board

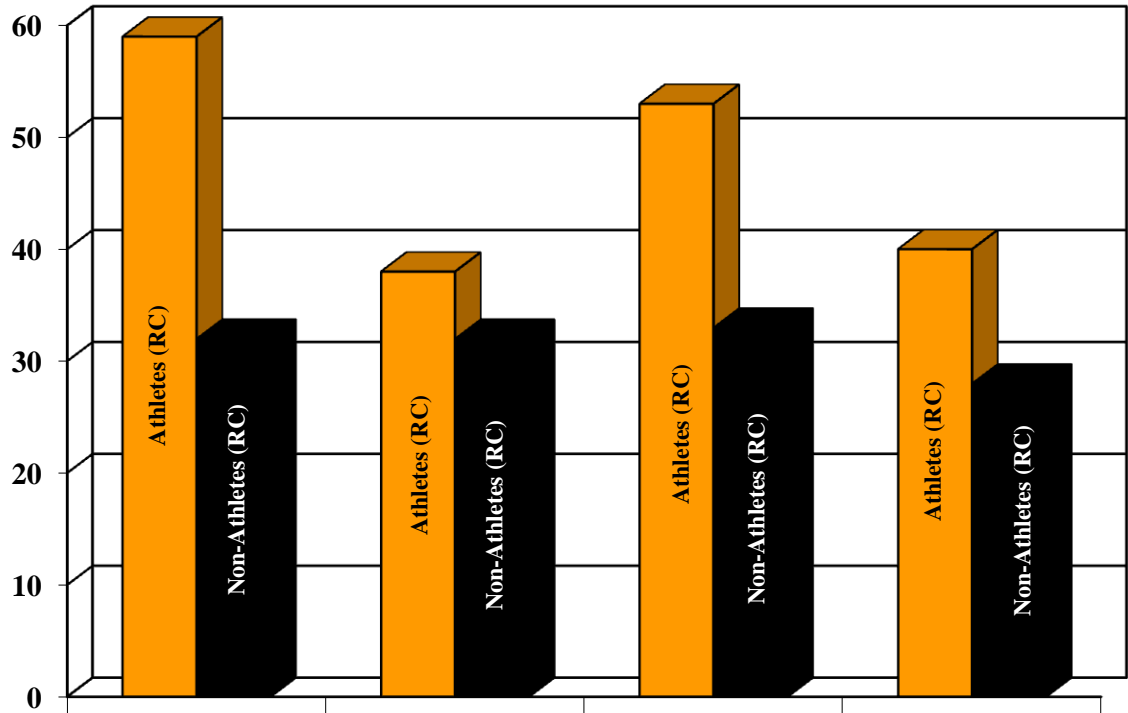
Cohort Graduation Rates (IPEDS) (Percent of Cohort Graduated)

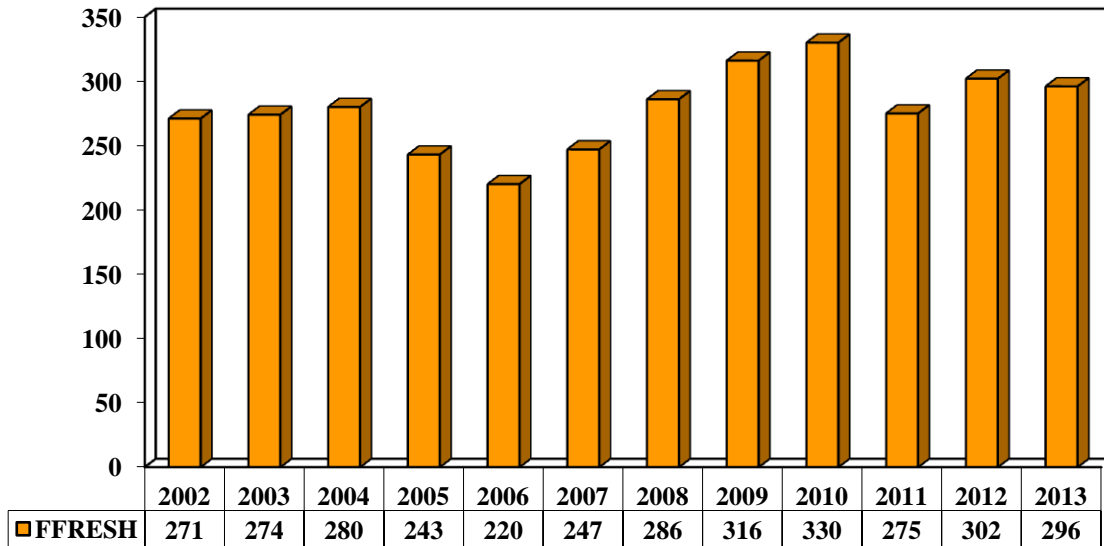
Athlete Cohort Graduation Rates (Percent of Cohort Graduated)

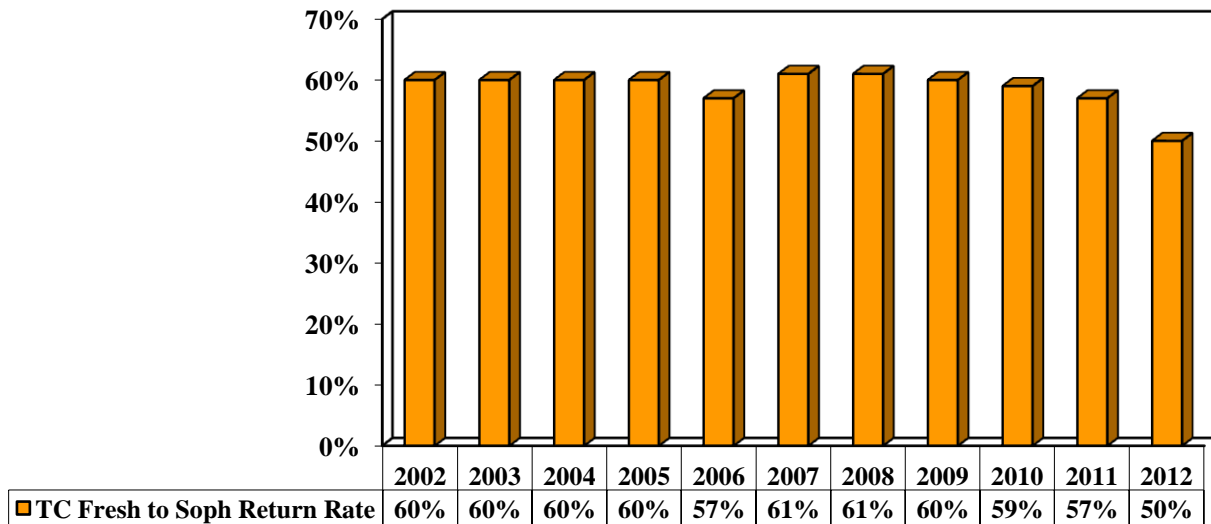
Freshman Rates

*First-time Freshman defines the student who has never attended another college prior to attending Tusculum College.

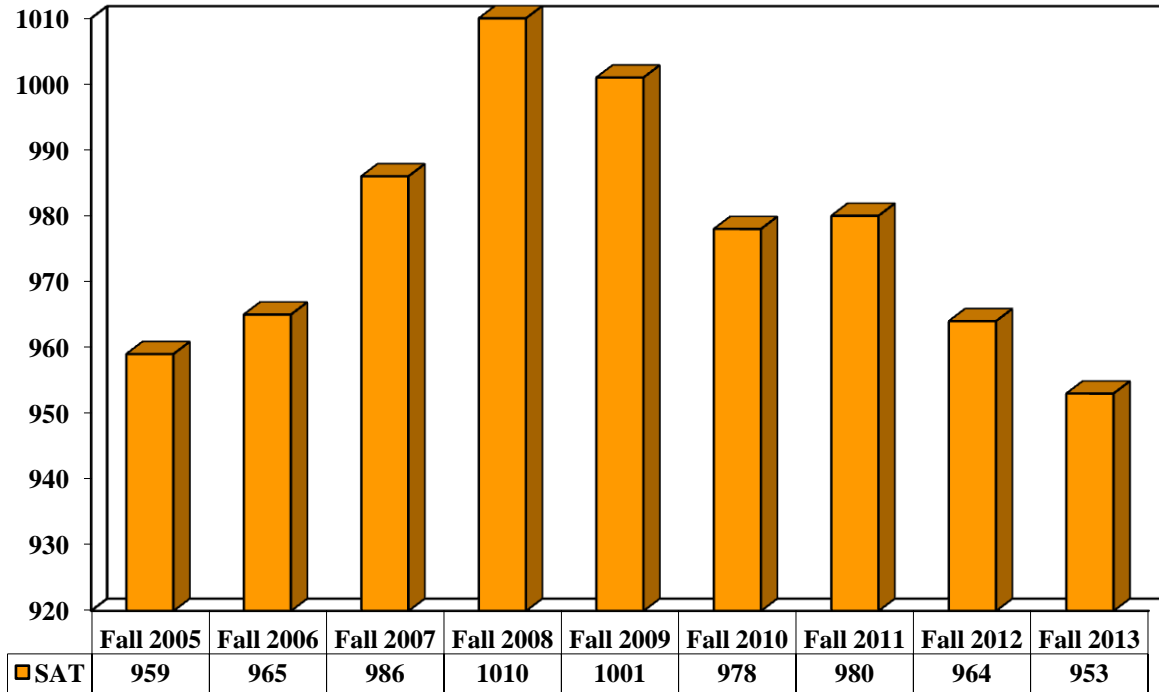
Cohort Return Rate x Cohort Year Fall Freshmen Returning For Sophomore Year**



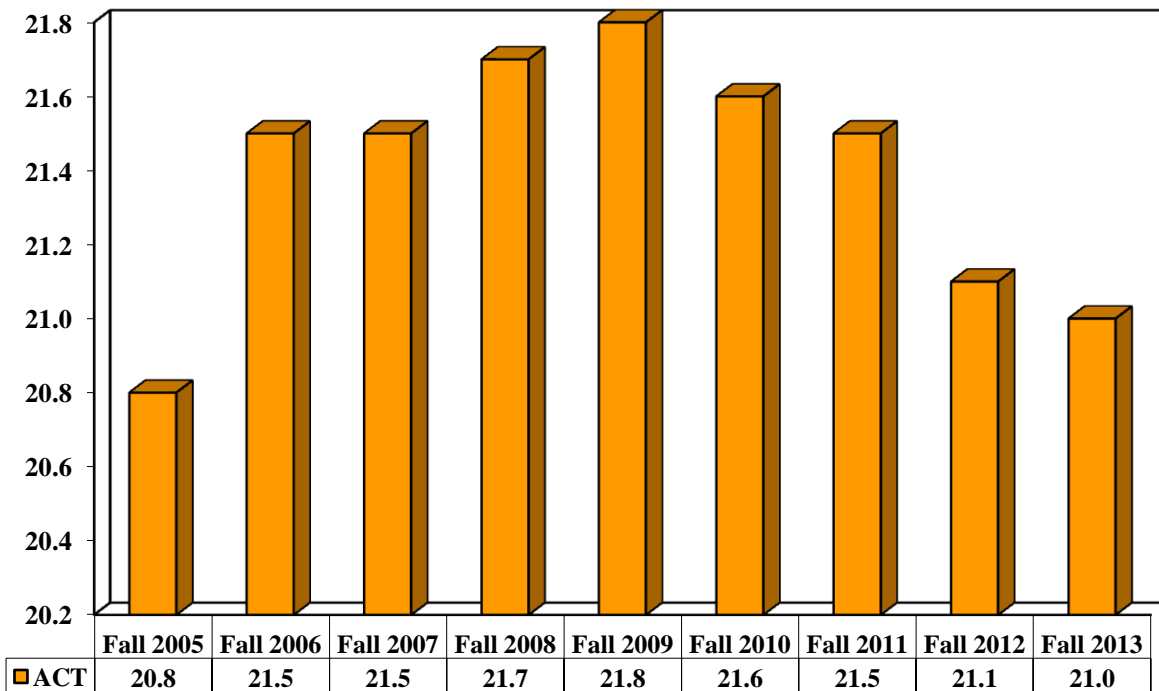
