


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#### **Ten Year Fall Enrollment History**








#### Graduate and Professional Studies Average Class Size



#### Graduate & Professional Studies Cost per Semester Hour





# **Cohort Graduation Rates (IPEDS)**(Percent of Cohort Graduated)





# **Athlete Cohort Graduation Rates** (Percent of Cohort Graduated)






## Cohort Return Rate x Cohort Year Fall Freshmen Returning For Sophomore Year\*\*




