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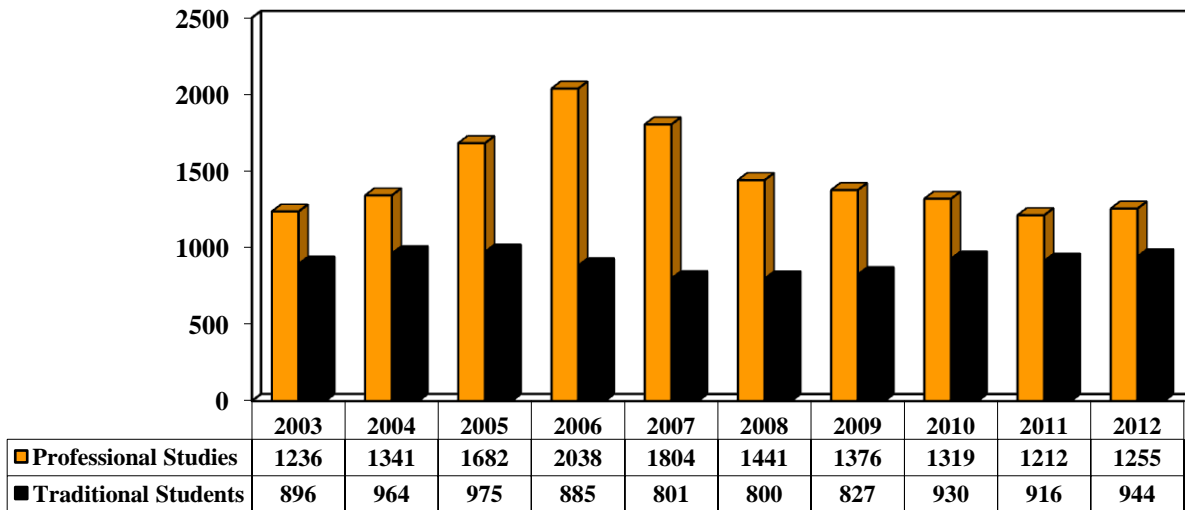

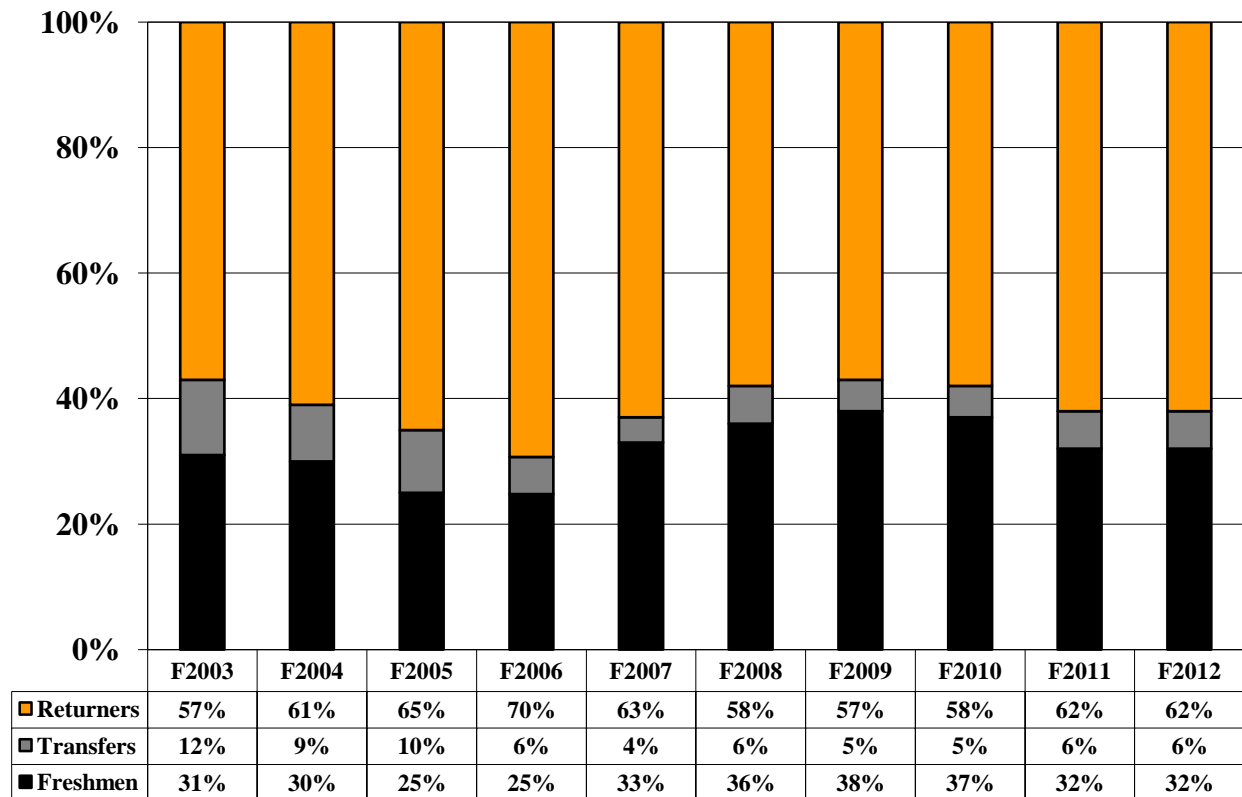

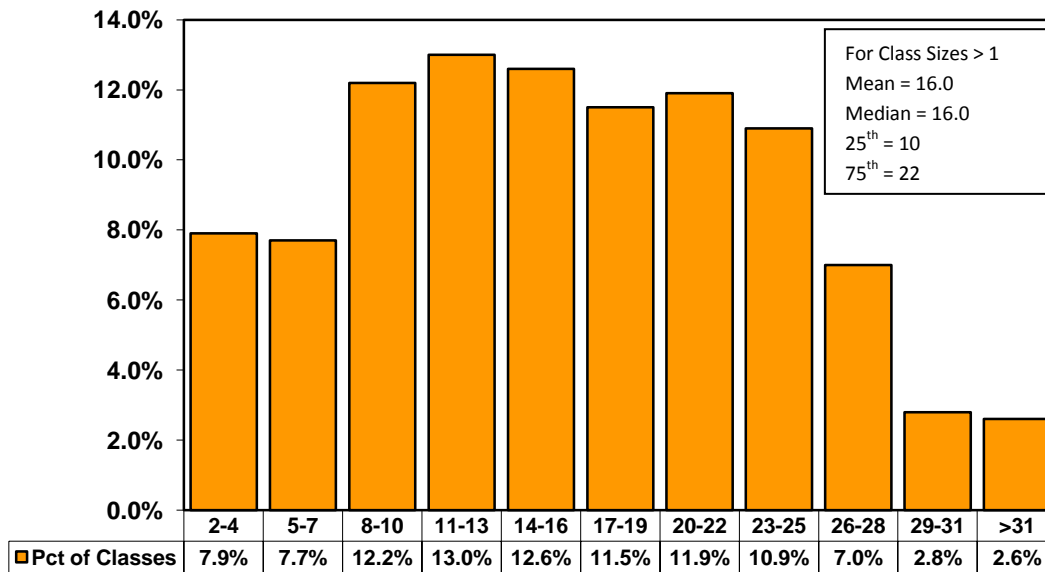

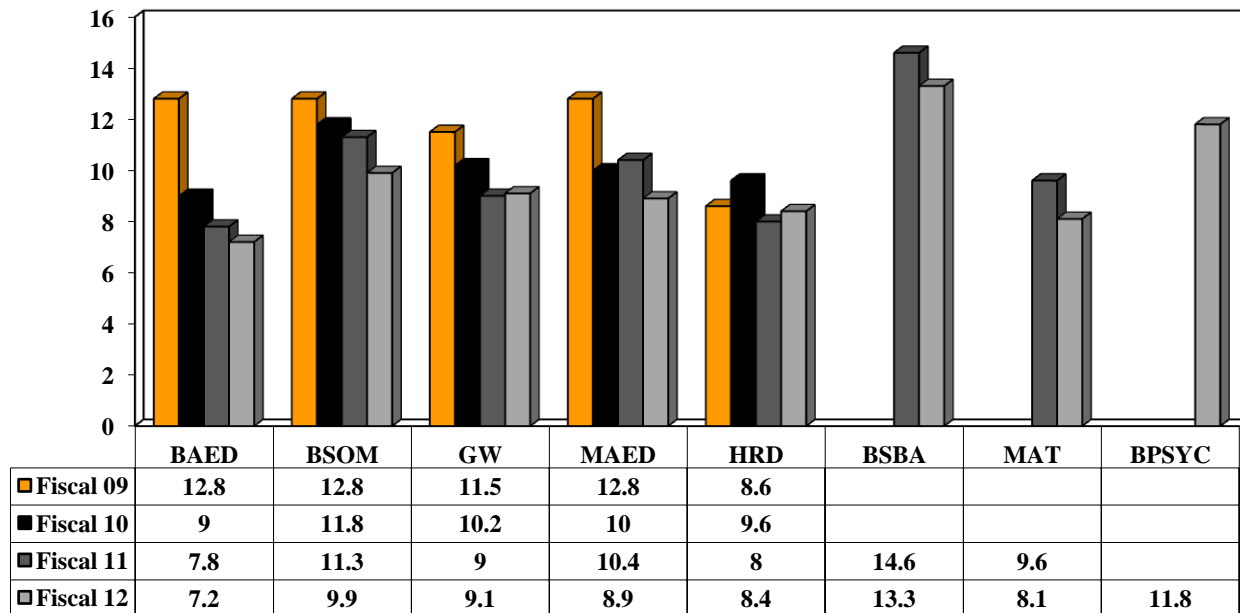

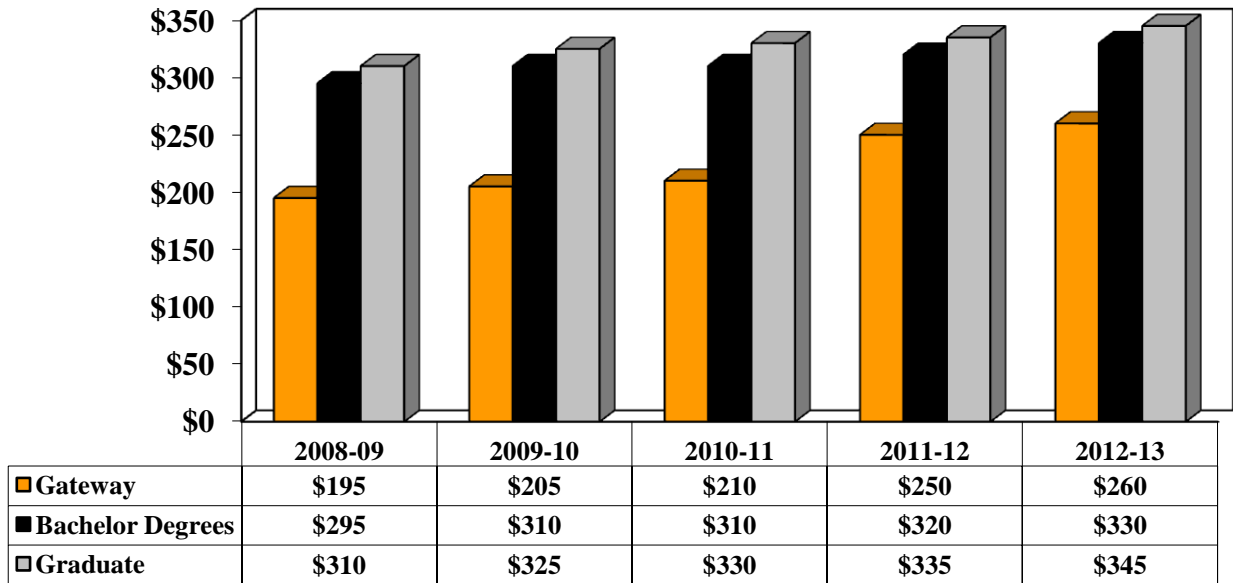


## Graduate and Professional Studies Average Class Size (Class Size >2)

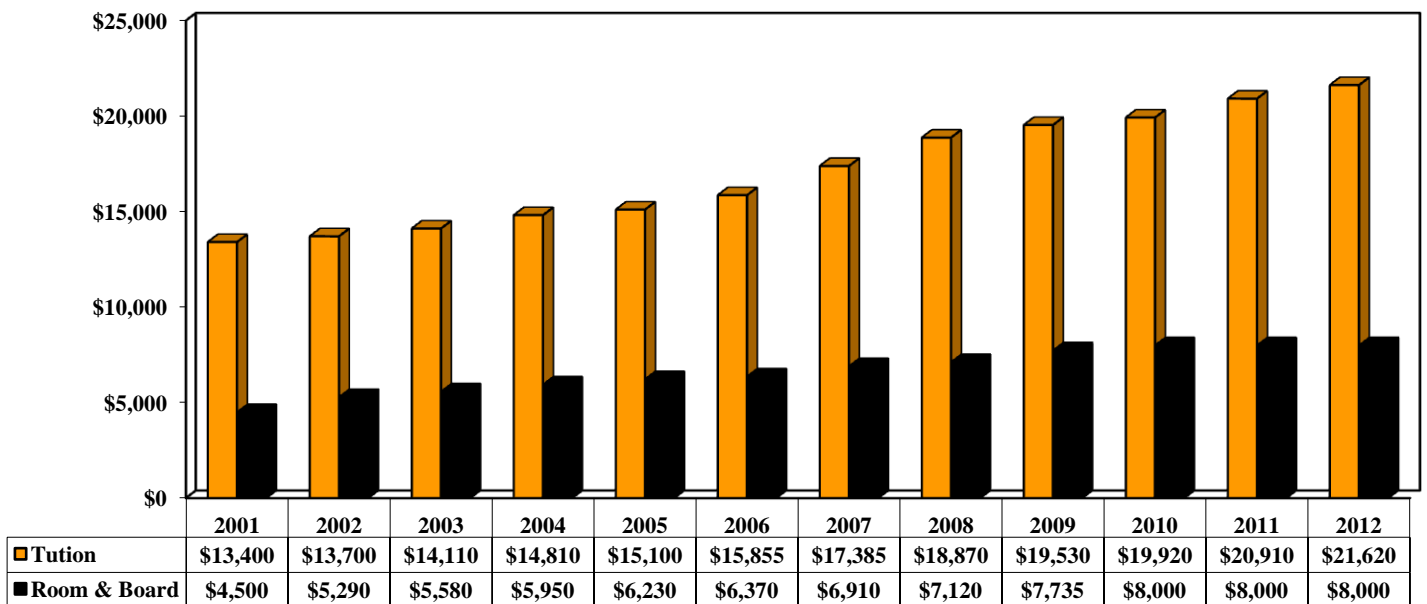

## Graduate & Professional Studies Cost per Semester Hour

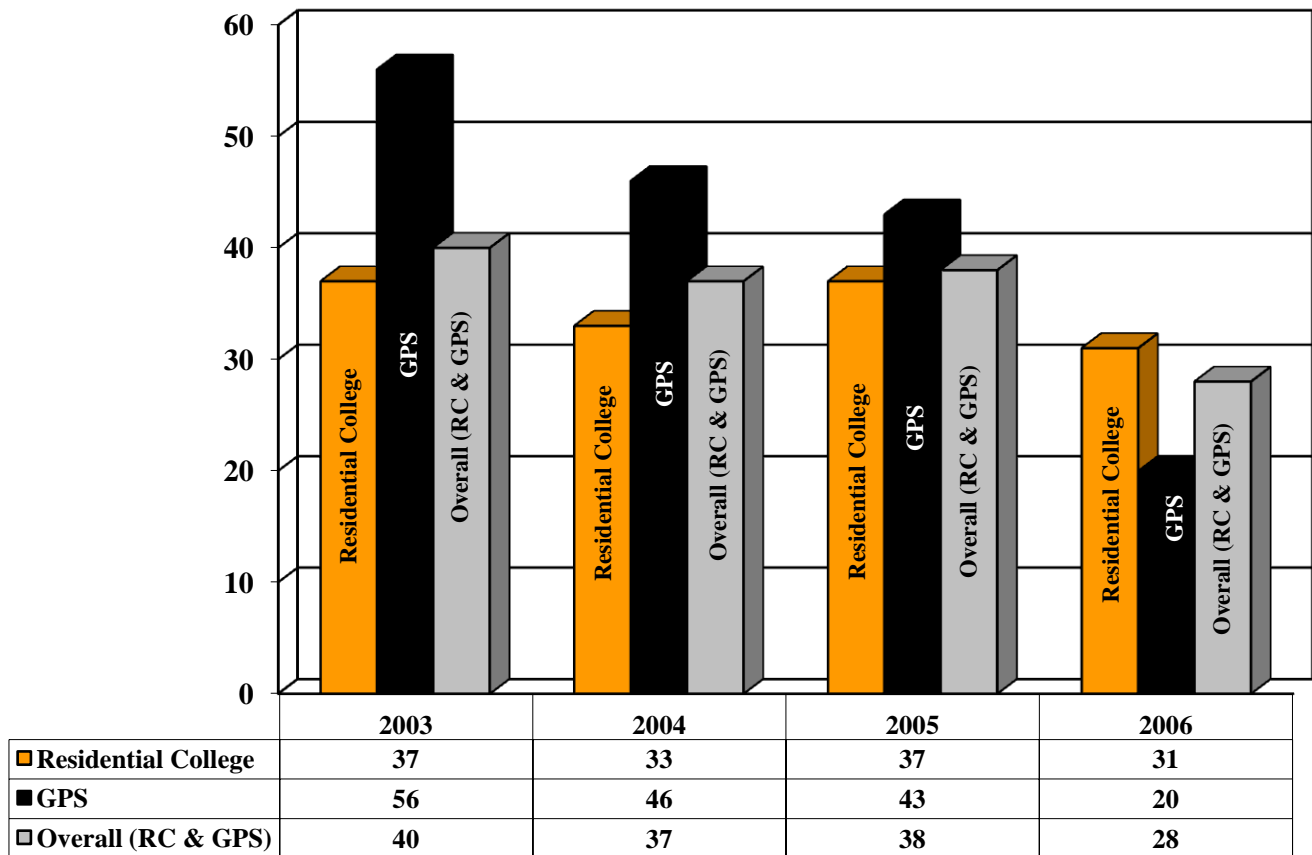

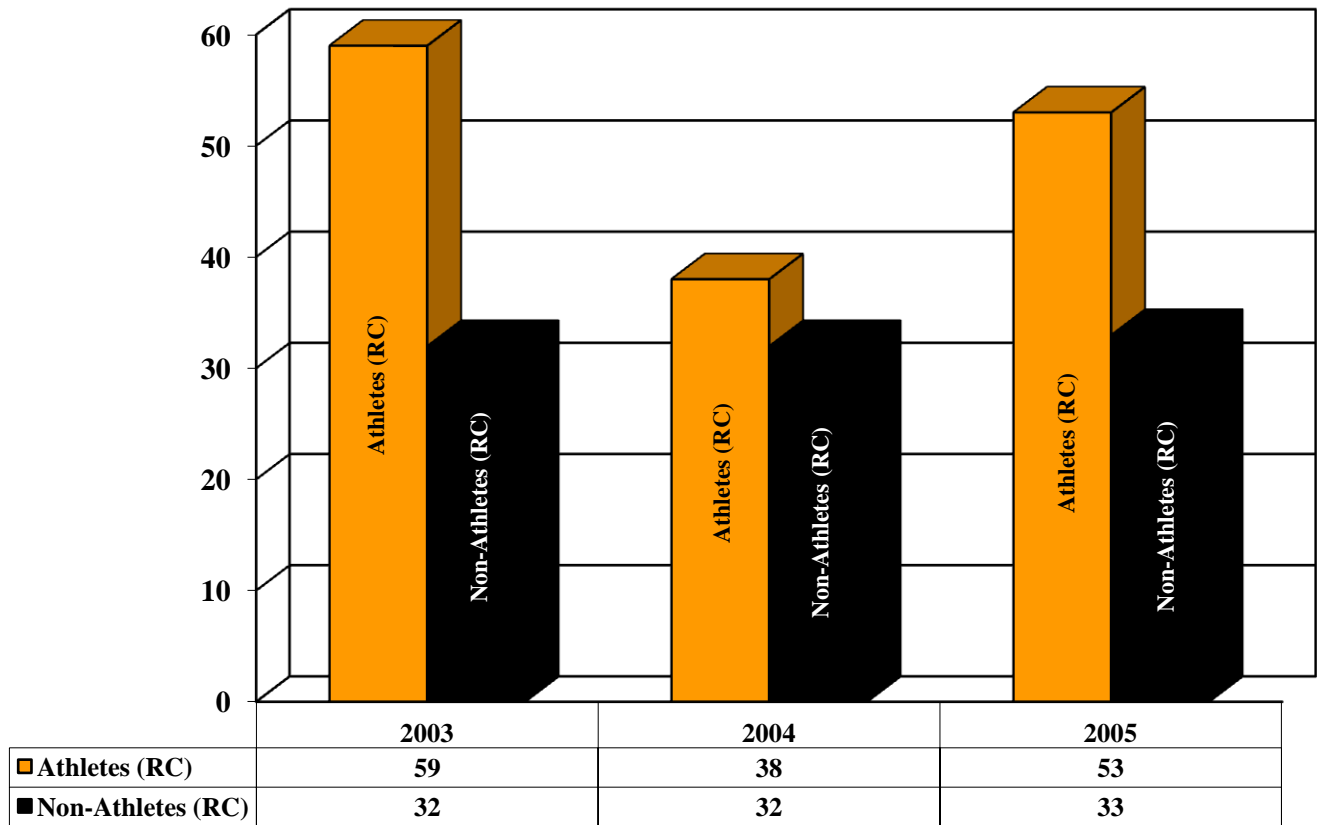
# 6-Year Graduation Rates

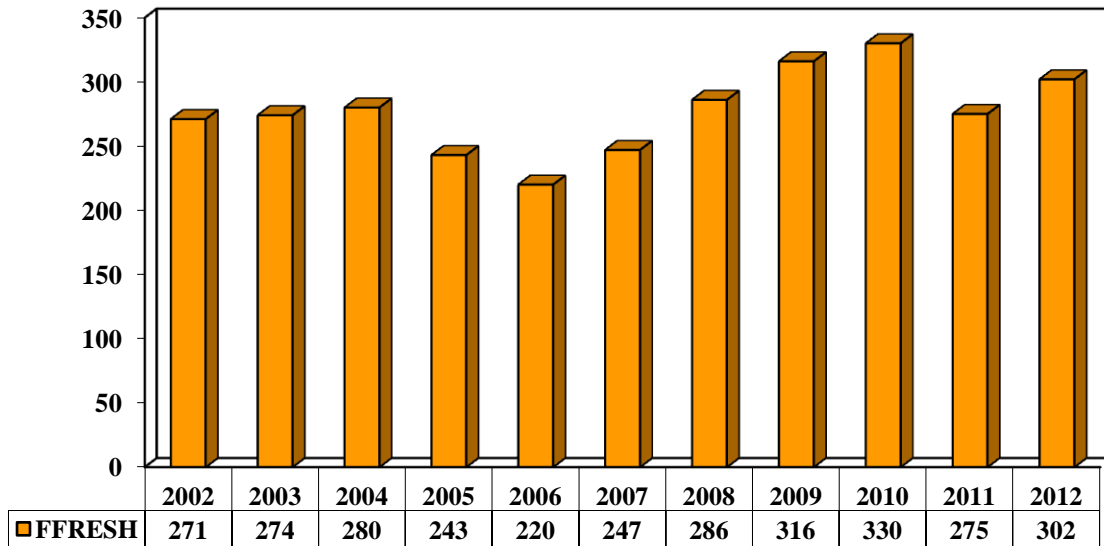
## Athlete Cohort Graduation Rates (Percent of Cohort Graduated)





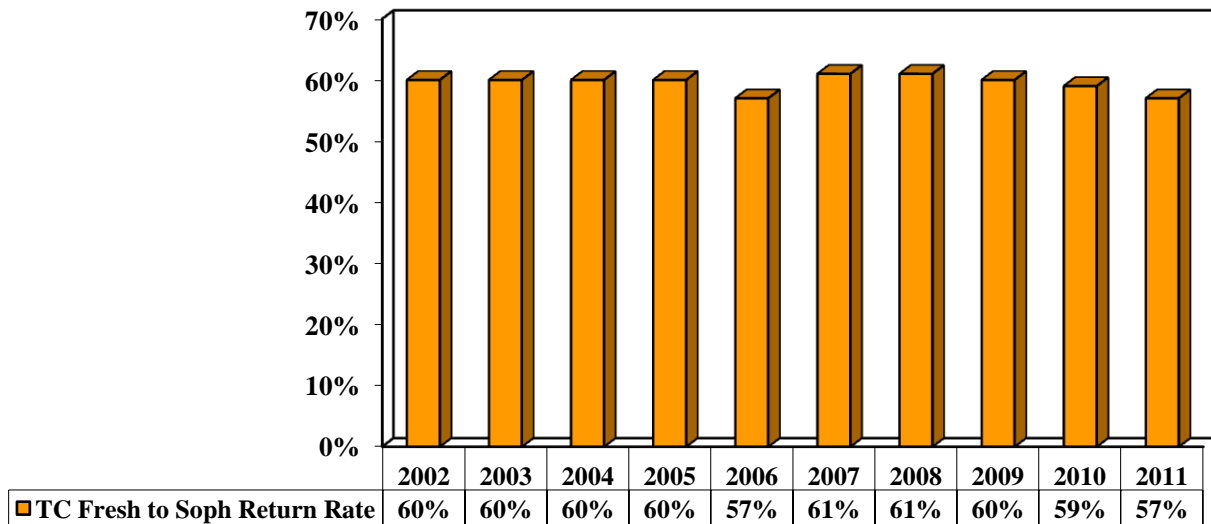
# Freshman Rates

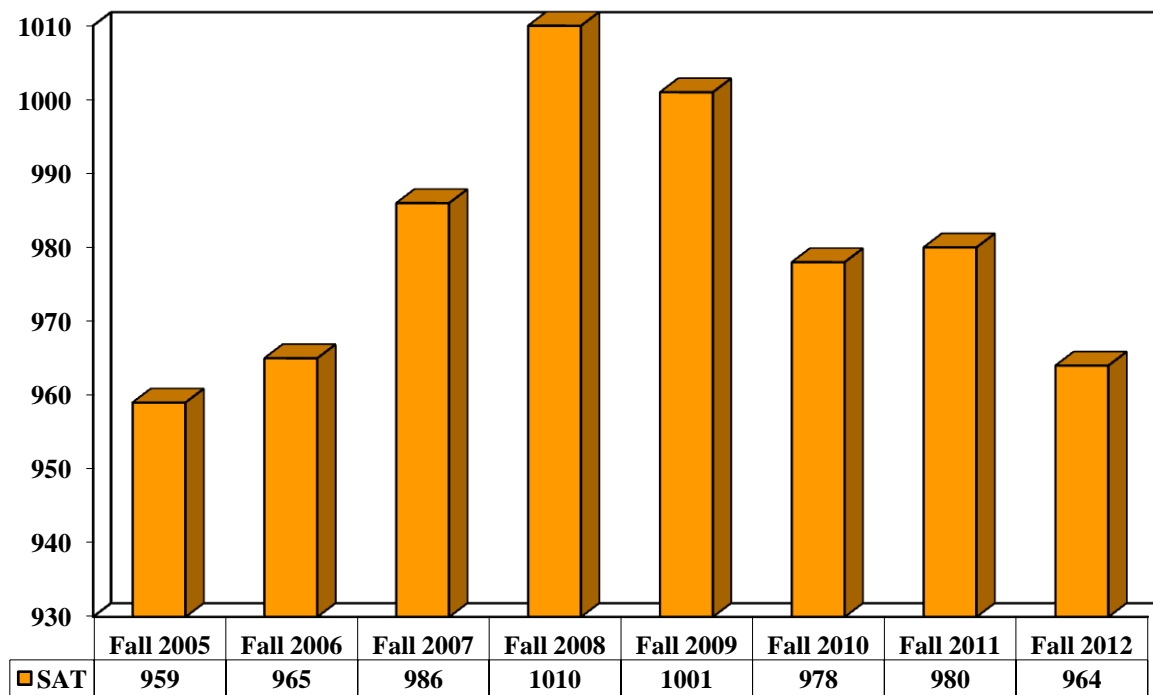
## Cohort Return Rate x Cohort Year Fall Freshmen Returning For Sophomore Year\*\*



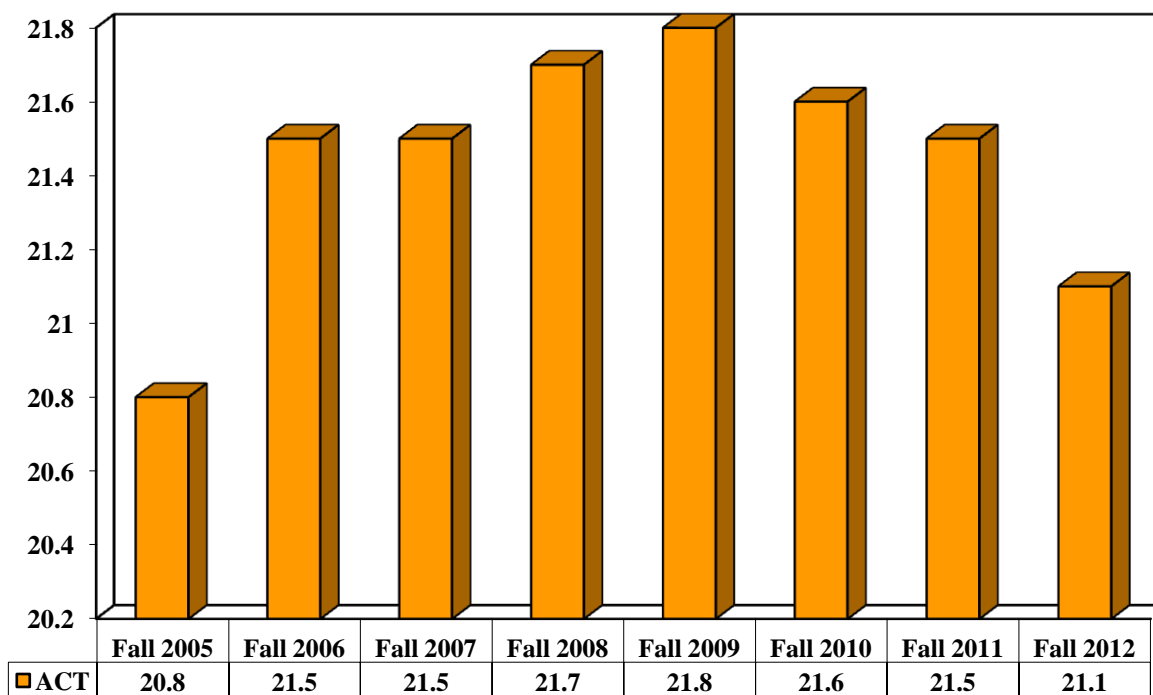
