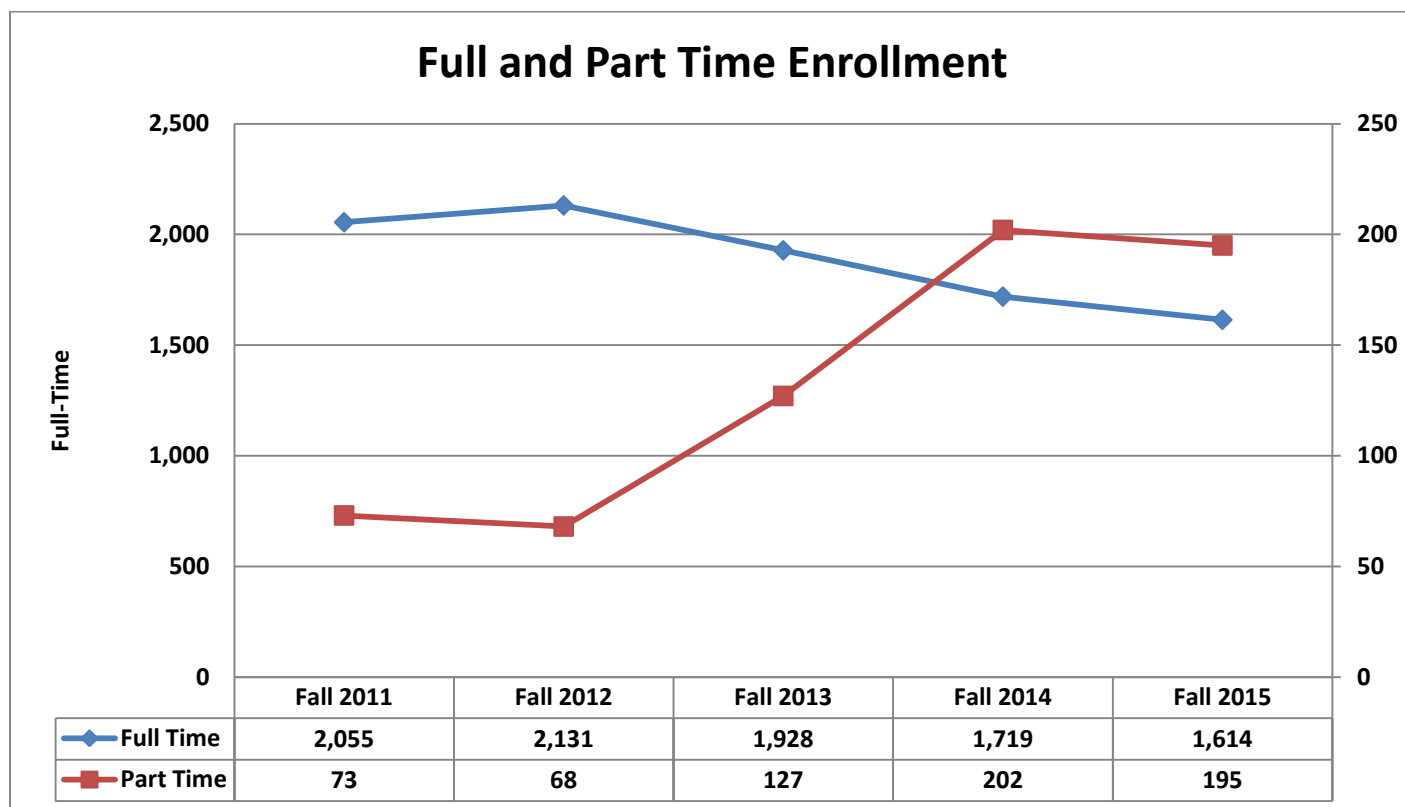

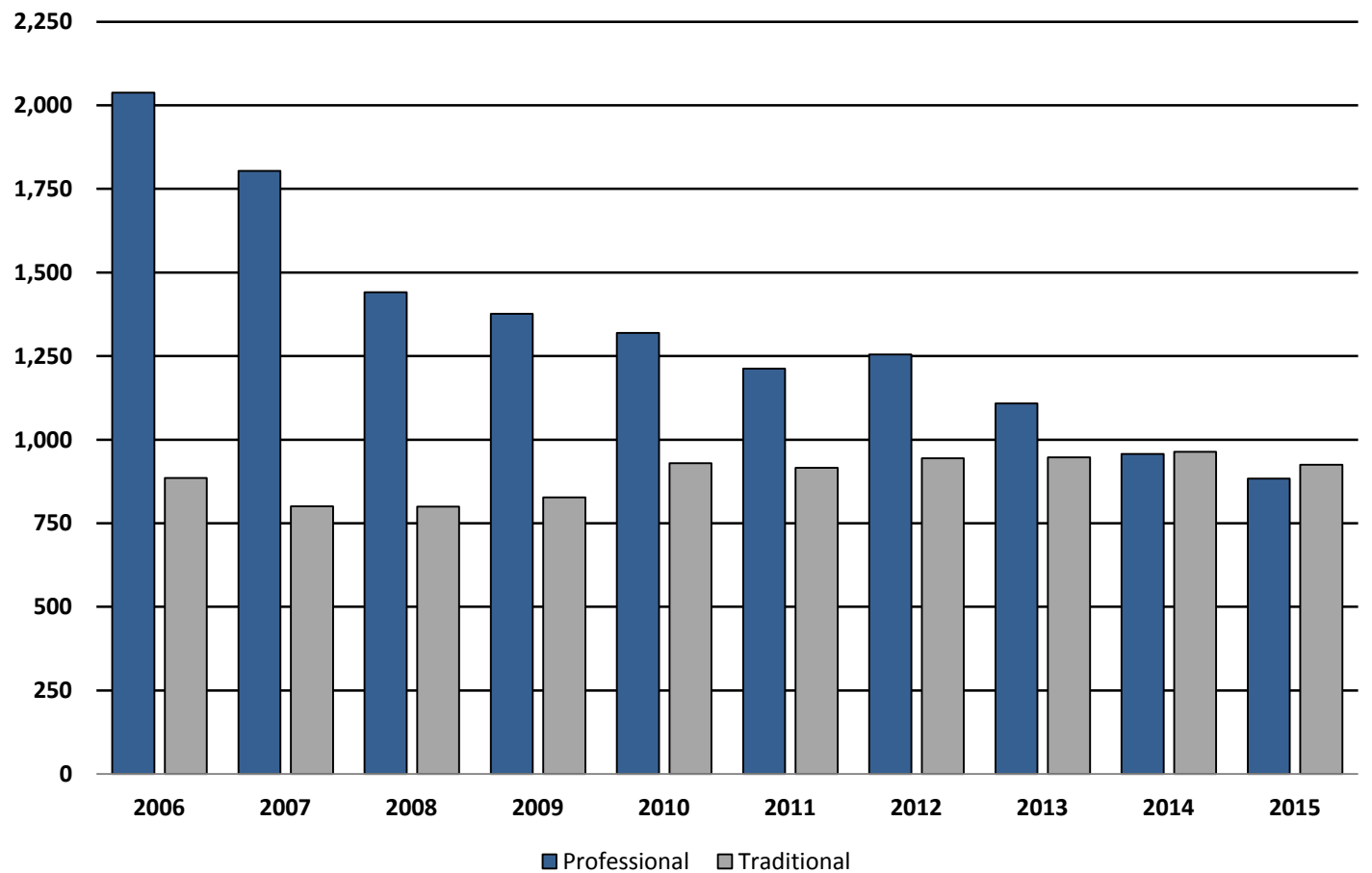

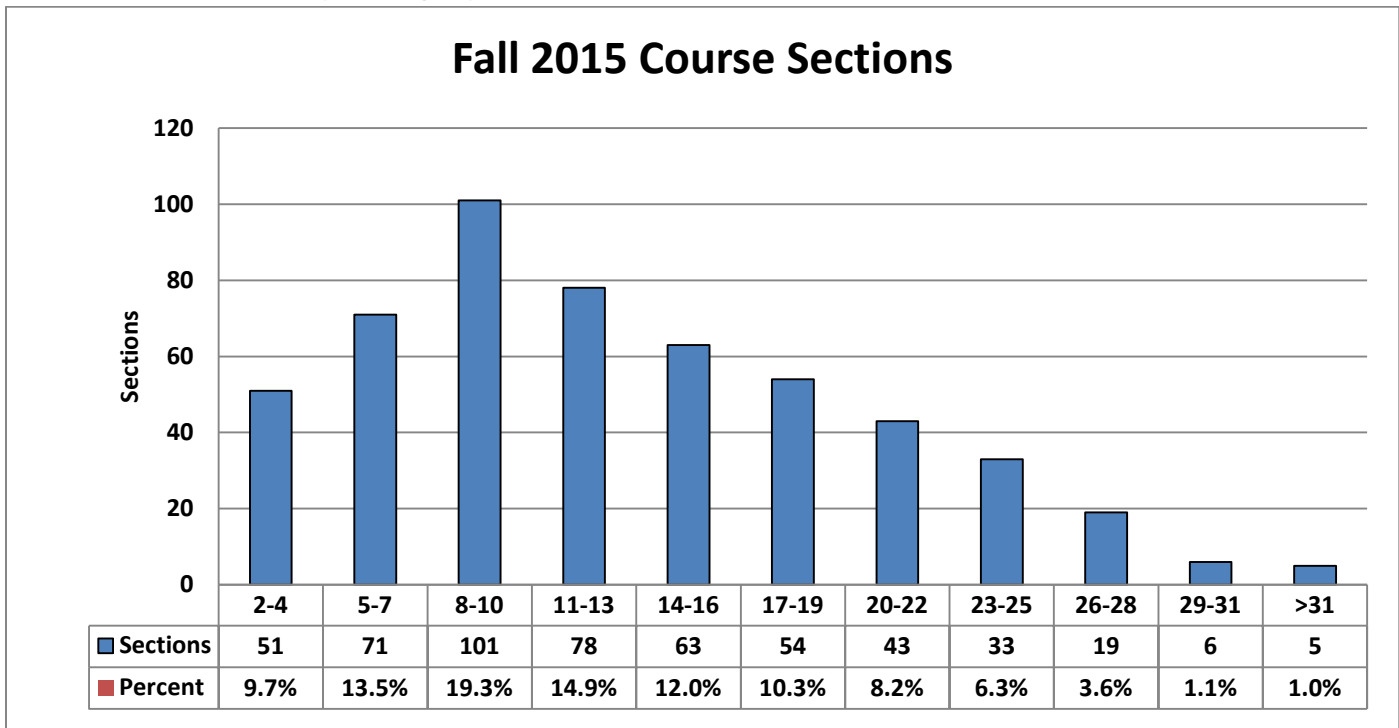

Fall 2015 Class Size by Category

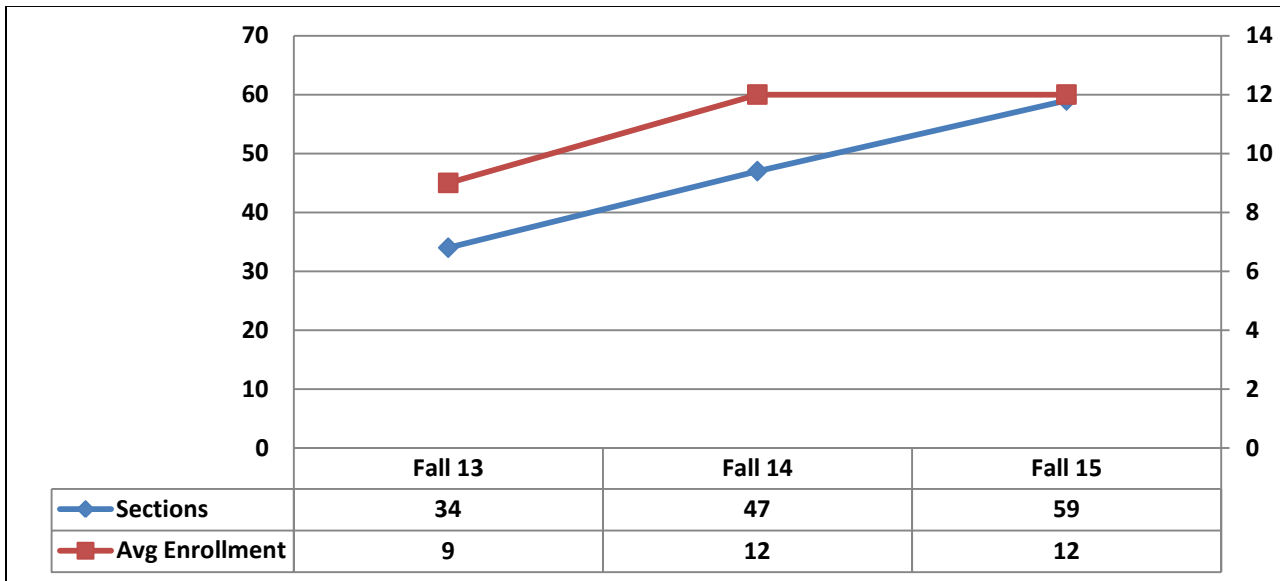

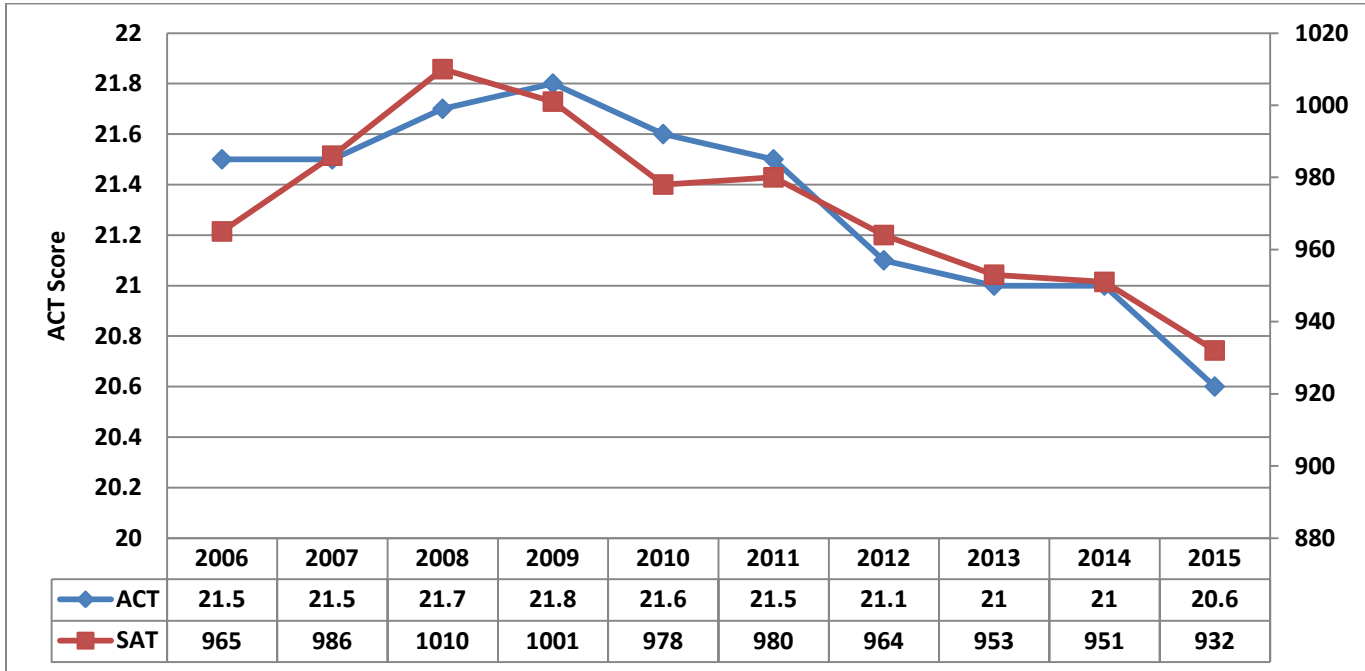

Online Course Enrollment by Fall Term

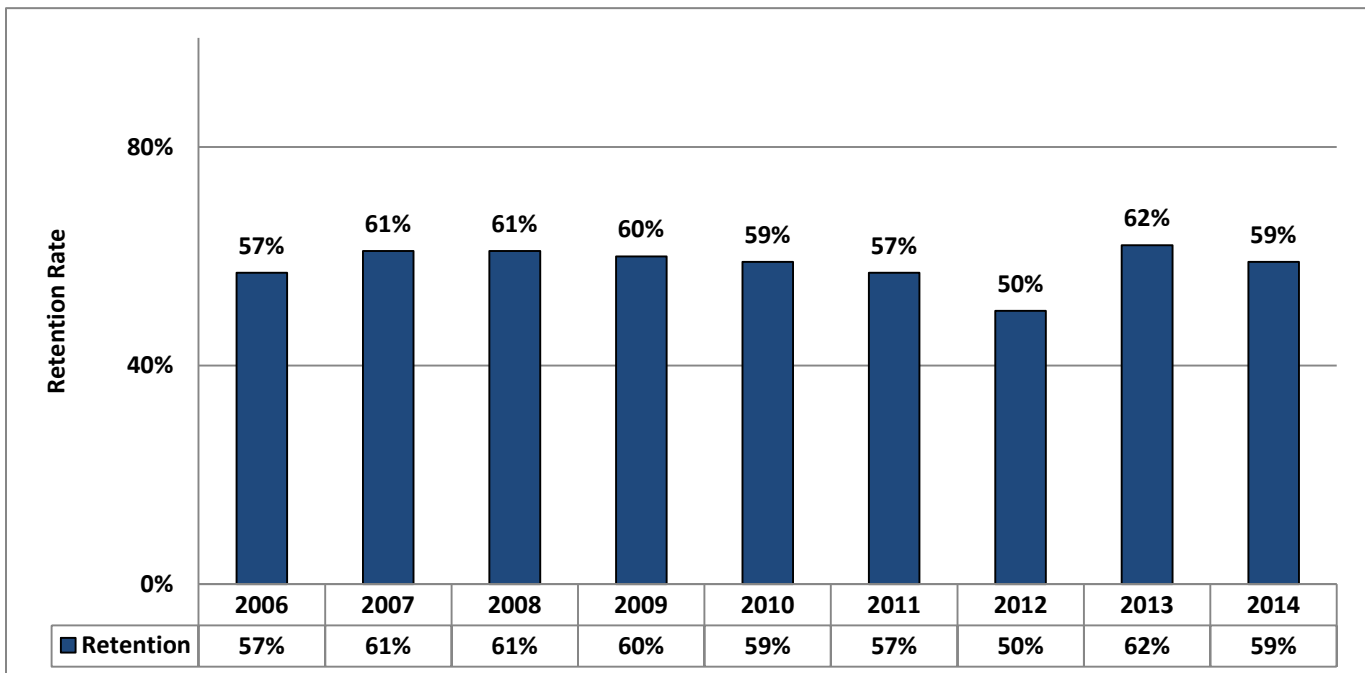

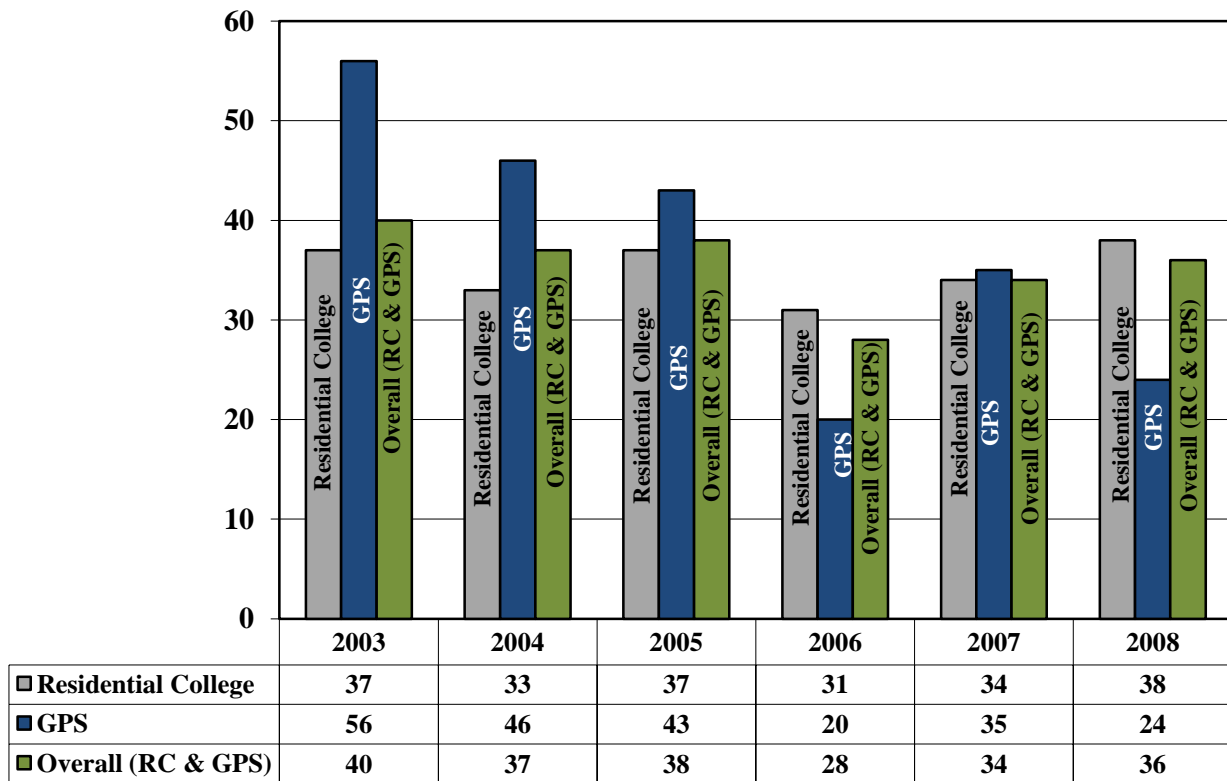

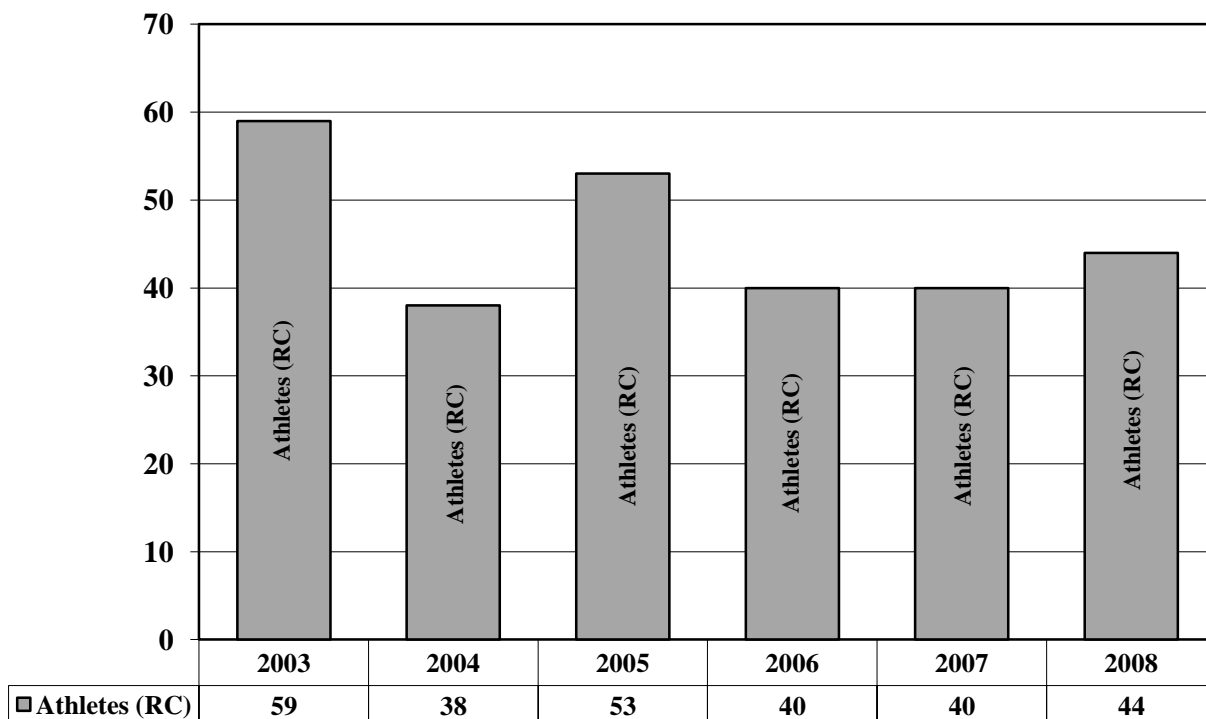

Cohort Graduation Rates (IPEDS) (Percent of Cohort Graduated)



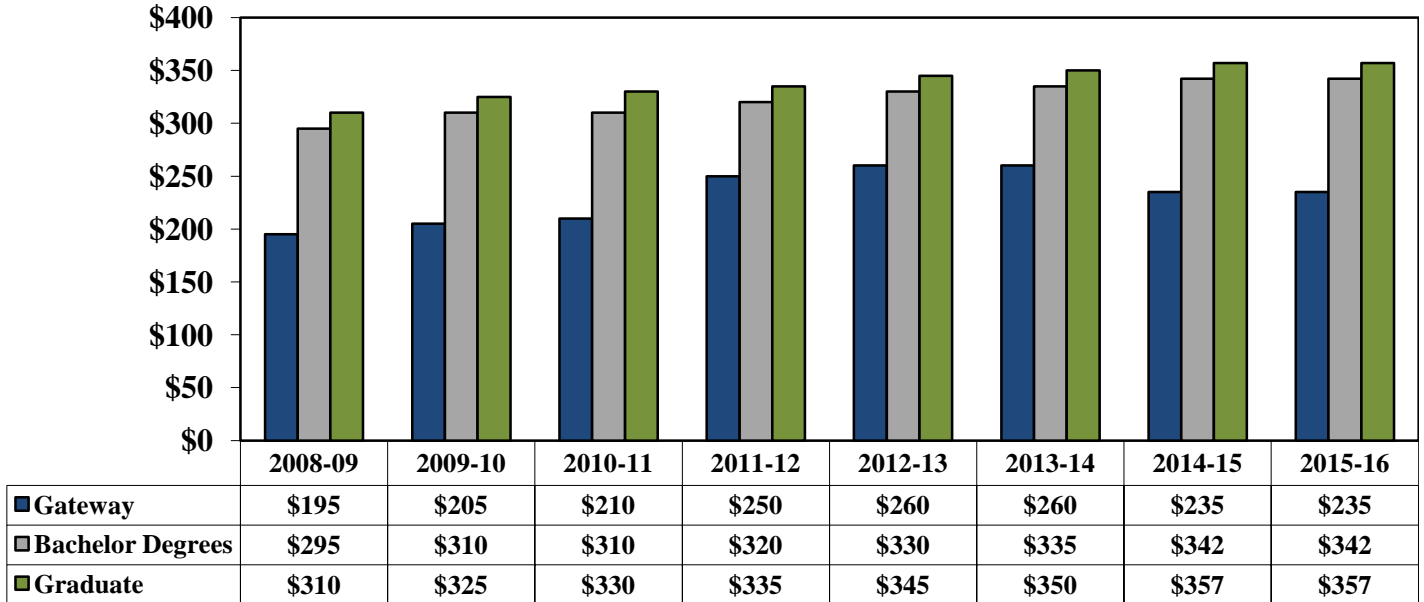
Scholarship Athlete Cohort Graduation Rates (Percent of Cohort Graduated)



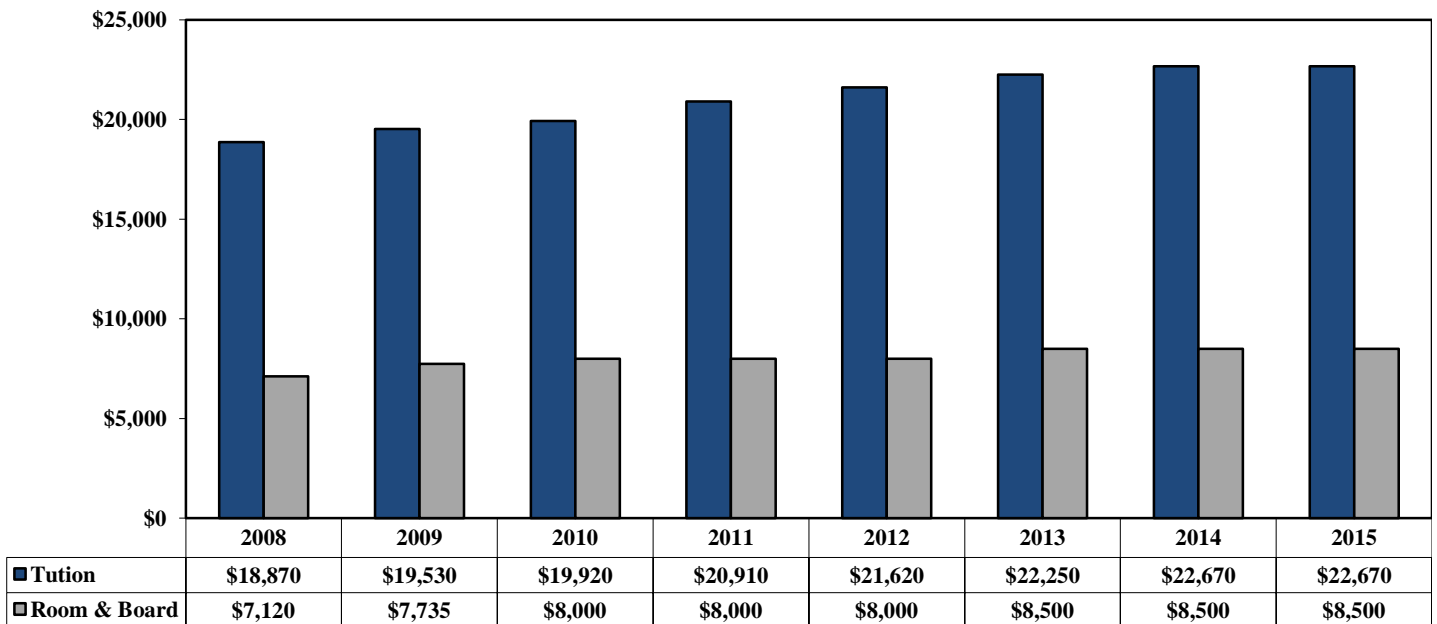
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Tuition and Financial Aid
